Resolution # 2015-30:

- The School Board asked St. Johns County voters to approve a Half-Cent Sales Tax for critical capital infrastructure
- Called for the formation of a Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) to advise and monitor the expenditure of the sales tax proceeds
- Required an annual report of the CAC every January
- On November 3, 2015, the voters approved the Half-Cent Sales Tax
- Collections began on January 1, 2016








Switzerland Point Middle School Phase 2 Roof Replacement AFTER





Sales Tax used for Security

- Centegix: Mobile Panic Alarm Badges
 - Per Alyssa's Law (SB 70), all public schools, including charters, were required to be outfitted with mobile panic alert systems.
 - The system will enable all school staff to silently and easily contact law enforcement to respond in the case of an on-campus threat or crisis.
